The MOVE Texas Field Organizing Internship provides the opportunity to build community leadership and organizing skills, meet local elected officials, mobilize voters to the polls, and register thousands of young people at the same time. The Field Organizing Internship is offered in Austin, Dallas, Laredo, San Antonio, San Marcos, and Seguin.

What You'll Do:

- Register thousands of Texas voters on college campuses, at special events, and in your community
- Teach young people about civic participation and why they need to have a voice in our democracy
- Mobilize voters during election season through Get Out the Vote (GOTV) efforts, including phone-banking, block-walking, Parties at the Polls and other special events
- Learn directly from elected officials, community leaders, and public professionals while building your own professional network
- Research and write on policy issues that interest you, publishing your work on our website and social media
- Work 10-15 unpaid hours per week, including occasional nights and weekends

What You'll Get:

- College-level credit (per your education institution's requirements)
- First class field organizing experience – former MOVE Texas Fellows and Interns are running political campaigns, working for elected officials, managing nonprofit teams, and interning in Washington, D.C.
- A first-hand understanding of the political process in Texas
